Winter Weather and School Closings

Forthcoming conditions may necessitate a closing, two-hour delay, or early dismissal for safety reasons. This being the case, we urge all Miquon families to make child care contingency plans in the event that we are forced to close, delay school, or dismiss early tomorrow or Wednesday.

If there is any variety of closing, we will alert all families via the Connect 5 messaging system as soon as possible. Please stay close to your preferred communication device on file with Miquon over the next 12-18 hours for an alert.

If you do not receive a message and you're wondering about our closing decision, you may check Miquon.org and KYW for a notice.

If you do not hear from us, and if there is no notice on the Miquon website, then know that we will be open for school as usual.

Two Hour Delay

A 2-hour delayed opening schedule is as follows:

9:45 am Early Morning Care opens

10:15 am Classrooms open

10:25 am Buzzer sounds

3:00 pm Dismissal as usual

If your child rides a bus or Miquon van, please have your child ready for pick up exactly 2 hours later than his or her normal pick-up time, allowing for the fact that driving conditions may cause some slight delays.

Early Dismissal

Whenever possible, early dismissals are scheduled for 12:00 noon. Parents permitted to pick up children anytime before the official dismissal time.

11:30-11:55 am Often during this time, children are permitted to eat lunches
12:00 pm Buzzer sounds; buses, cars, and vans depart as usual


