This Thurs, May 2, alumna Rebecca Silverstein Whipple '93 will visit campus to read her debut children's book to the Nursery and Kindergarten and to visit with Diane & Sarah's fifth and sixth grade class to talk about the process of writing and publishing the book.

Rebecca Whipple is a gifted painter, author and illustrator based in San Francisco. *When I Was Big and You Were Little* is her debut picture book, written and illustrated by the artist and published in December of 2018. In this bedtime story: A tired child, Pina, fights to stay awake. Just as sleep seems to have won out, Pina finds herself transformed — now she is big and her father is little. Pina and her father set out into the night, on a wild and beautiful adventure to the edges of her imagination.


