Checkout limits

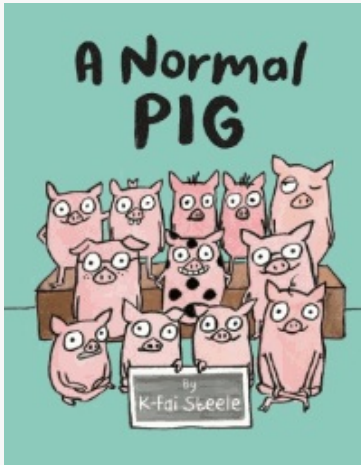
N and K students may check out 1 book per week, limit 2 books checked out total.

Students in 1st - 4th grades may check out 1 or 2 books per week, limit 5 books checked out total.

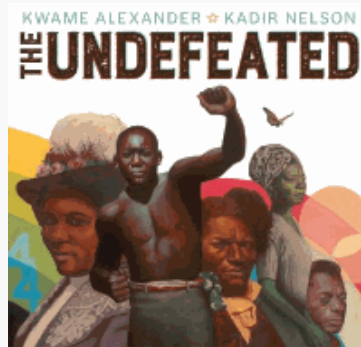
Students in 5th and 6th grades have a limit of 10 books checked out total.
